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REGION V BYLAWS

IDAHO SCHOOL BOARDS ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I—RULES OF ORDER

1. Where no provision or exception is made in these bylaws, Robert's Rules of Order shall govern.
2. The 5th District Trustees Association operates as a regional association affiliate of the Idaho School Boards Association.
3. Nothing in these bylaws may be in conflict with the State Association, state or federal laws or any higher authority. Should such an event arise, this higher authority takes precedence over the lower and said item shall be null and void.

ARTICLE II—AMENDING OR CHANGING OF BYLAWS

1. These bylaws may be amended or changed or new bylaws adopted by simple majority vote of those present at any regular or special district meeting provided that the notice calling said meeting shall set forth the changes to be considered.
2. Proposals for by-law changes may be made by any duly elected or appointed trustee of the 5th District holding membership with this group, 5th District Trustee Association.
3. Proposal changes to the bylaws will be given to the 5th District Trustee Chair for action of the group as a whole at the next regular or special trustee meeting.

ARTICLE III—MEETINGS

1. Once annually the 5th District Trustees shall convene in a general 5th District meeting. This meeting is called by the region chairperson. This meeting will be held at the ISBA Annual Convention.
2. The 5th District chair may call regular meetings of the association to transact the region's orderly business needs. Sufficient time must be given to afford notice of said meeting.
3. Special meetings or emergency meetings may be called by the region chair. Since they would deal with specific, pressing problems that need immediate resolution, an alert and notice could be made by email.

48 sufficient time to afford notice, for the purpose of educating, training,
49 enlightening, organizing, directing, or purely exchanging views, programs or
50 policies.

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53 **ARTICLE IV—NOMINATING AND ELECTION OFFICERS**

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55 1. The 5th District Trustees Association shall function with the elected offices of
56 Chair, Vice Chair, large district alternate, and small district alternate. The Office
57 of Secretary is an attached office to be filled by the Superintendent of the elected
58 Chair.

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61 2. For the purpose of election of officers only, the membership of Region V of the
62 5th District Trustees shall be divided into large (5A, 4A, 3A) schools and small
63 2A, and 1A) schools. It is the intent that the Chair and Vice Chair shall represent
64 both a large and small district. When the Chair is from a large district,
65 nomination for Vice Chair for that election cycle shall be from small-size school
66 district and from a large-size school district when the Chair is from a small
67 district. The Vice Chair shall automatically succeed to the Chair of the 5th
68 District.

73 3. Nomination of the Vice Chair of the 5th District shall be from the floor at the 5th
74 District Trustees Annual Meeting in which an election is held.

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78 4. The election of the Vice Chair shall be held in odd-numbered years by paper
79 ballot, one vote per member present at the Annual Meeting held in conjunction
80 with the ISBA Annual Convention, simple majority determining the winner. In the
81 event of a tie, the outgoing Chair shall cast a tie-breaking vote though he/she
82 shall have previously voted.

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87 5. The newly-elected Vice Chair shall take office and the Vice Chair shall assume
88 the office of Chair with the installation of executive officers at the ISBA Annual
89 Meeting and shall serve for a term of two years or until their successors are
90 elected and qualified. Transfer of records and materials of office shall be affected
91 as soon as possible subsequent to the new chair's assumption of office.

6. In the case of a vacancy in the office of Chair, the Vice Chair shall succeed to the office of Chair. The Chair shall fill a vacancy of the Vice Chair, Large or Small District Alternates by appointment, with the appointee serving until the next Annual Meeting when a person shall be elected. In case of vacancy for both the Chair and Vice Chair, the Large and Small District Alternates shall replace the positions in accordance with the odd and even year principle outlined in the Elections section of the Bylaws.
