DISTRICT PROFILE:

Rockland School District No. 382 consists of grades K-12 with an enrollment of approximately 177 students. The first Rockland School Building was a log house built by volunteer labor in 1883. This building served as a meeting place for the community, as well as a social center where dances and celebrations were held - not unlike the current building. Several schoolhouses have served the district since that time with the latest being built in 1994. The District currently has a bond and supplemental levy in place. The patrons of the Rockland School District constantly show the District support as they continuously have passed bonds and levies over many years. The District receives strong support from its local businesses as well. The District offers Idaho Digital Learning (IDLA), Dual Credit, and AP Courses of which roughly 30% of students in grades 7-12 participate in one or more courses each year. The District is proud to have a 99% High School Graduation Rate running since 2011. Additionally, the District is a Microsoft Imagine Academy.

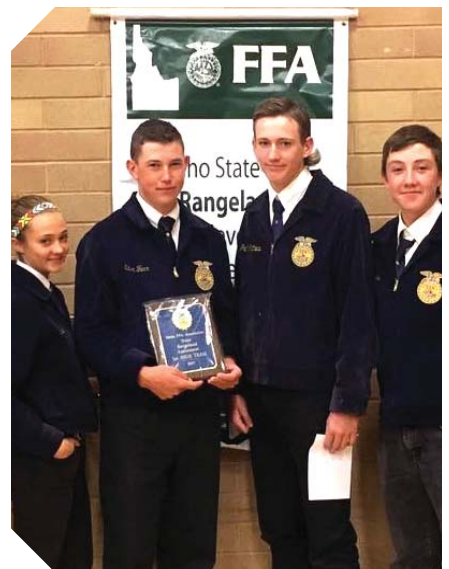
