THE COMMUNITY



The District is located in Bonneville and Bingham Counties, and comprises a portion of the city of Idaho Falls along with the incorporated cities of Ammon, Iona, and Ucon. It also includes the unincorporated county areas to the north, south, and east of Idaho Falls. Idaho Falls is the 4th largest city in Idaho: home to the College of Eastern Idaho and serves as a regional hub for health care, travel, retail, technology, and business in eastern Idaho. Idaho State University, BYU-Idaho, and University of Idaho-Idaho Falls are all located in the region. The District is one of the largest employers in the area along with the Idaho National Laboratory and Eastern Idaho Regional Medical Center. Residents and visitors enjoy the Farmers Market, the Idaho Falls Zoo, minor league baseball, as well as various cultural offerings such as the Willard Arts Center. Art Museum of Eastern Idaho. Museum of Idaho, and the Colonial Theatre. Outdoor enthusiasts enjoy fishing, hunting, hiking, golfing, biking, camping, nearby ski resorts, and many other great activities. The Snake River provides a variety of water activities as well as a 6-mile River Walk. Idaho Falls is often referenced as the Gateway to National Parks. Yellowstone, Grand Teton National Parks, Jackson Hole, Caribou National Forest. Craters of the Moon National Monument are a nearby drive. Visitors can easily travel to Idaho Falls with nonstop flights to the local airport from cities such as Denver, Minneapolis-St. Paul, Salt Lake City, and many more.
