What have you accomplished while serving on your local school board?

The first year I was on the Board, we passed a bond levy for a building addition. We have passed our supplemental levy every year (maintaining the same amount for the last four years). After

attending an ISBA conference, we sent all of our high school teachers on an overnight trip to observe a project-based learning school in California and have supported their efforts in adopting many of those techniques in their curriculum. Hiring a new superintendent four years ago was a great experience, and we are so proud of her leadership. We have implemented 1:1 devices in grades 7-12, and are increasing the use of tablets in the elementary schools. Most recently, we are supporting our elementary teachers in adopting specialty teaching and new curriculum.
