



Mail-in Only Precinct

Question:

One of the precincts in our District was a required mail in only precinct. Is this accurate? Can a County Clerk require that all ballots in any given area (precinct) be mailed in?

Answer:

Idaho Code section 34-308 authorizes the Board of County Commissioners to designate a precinct that has no more than 140 registered voters at the last general election may be designated as a mail ballot precinct. All voters in that precinct do vote by mail. Since all elections, under election consolidation, are conducted pursuant to title 34, electors vote by precinct. Those living within a mail ballot precinct receive all of the ballots on which they are entitled to vote by mail.
