

New Campaign Finance Laws

WHERE TO BEGIN

Treasurer Appointment & Reporting



Once a candidate has raised or spent \$500, a candidate must file the appointment of a political treasurer

and begin reporting the campaign finances, including the sources and expenses for the first \$500.

The Declaration of Candidacy filed to in for office designates the candidate as the default political treasurer, for those who have not met the \$500 threshold, until an alternate is appointed.

FILING DEADLINES

of each month in the year of the election

Annual report due January 10th following non-election years

\$50 FINE

each day after 48 hours late



⊘ Disclosures



All campaign material (signs, flyers, mailings, TV ads, etc.) should contain a disclosure statement. For

example: "Paid for Yosemite Sam for Governor, Elmer Fudd Treasurer".



REPORTING BASICS

All money raised or spent in relation to a campaign must be accounted for and tracked. This includes the use of the candidate's personal money.

All candidates for all offices now report online via the Secretary of State's Campaign Finance Portal. The portal may be found at https://sos.idaho.gov/elections-division/campaign-finance-filing/

For local officials, all assistance, oversight and enforcement will be done by the County Clerk of the home county for the city, school or local district.



Onation Limits

Maximum contribution is \$1,000 per individual, business* or political committee per election. Any single contribution of \$1,000 must be reported within **48 hours** of receipt.

*Businesses sharing controlling ownership may only contribute \$1,000 combined.





\$500 Threshold for Local Candidates

- Local candidates that do not raise or spend \$500, do not need to create a Campaign Finance account or file monthly reports.
 See Idaho Code 67-6608(1)
- <u>All</u> candidates must keep track and records of <u>any</u> money raised or spent (including personal money)
- Declaration of Candidacy contains appointment of a political treasurer that is defaulted to the candidate until they reach the \$500 threshold.



Filing Dates

• 10th of every month during the year of the election, annually during non-election years

Any contributions of \$1,000 must be reported within 48 hours

• \$50 fine for every day late, See Idaho Code 67-6625A



Contribution Limits

- \$1,000
 - Per person
 - Per company* or political committee
- No limits for the candidate contributions to own campaign
- Candidates may not coordinate on independent expenditures



Disclosures

- Materials should indicate: "Paid for by Yosemite Sam for Governor, Elmer Fudd Treasurer"
- The goal is transparency
- No one was ever fined for over-disclosure





Campaign Finance


- Filing occurs via the Secretary of State's website
- Oversight, assistance, and enforcement provided by County Clerk/Elections Office



Oversight/Roles

Elections

- Candidate filing and ballot questions prepared by Clerk of the District
- Election administration, verification of qualifications, conduct of election, certification of results by County Clerk





- September 3rd
 - Candidate Filing Deadline
- September 10th
 - Write-in Deadline
 - Final Candidates Due to Clerk
- September 13th
 - Ballot Question Deadline





- September 17th
 - Withdrawal Deadline
 - Recall Deadline
- October 4th
 - Absentee Ballot Mailing Deadline*
- October 8th
 - Pre-Registration Deadline





- October 18th
 - Early in-person voting begins
- October 21st
 - Poll watcher deadline
- October 22nd
 - Absentee Request Deadline
- October 29th
 - Last Day of Early Voting






- November 2nd
 - Election Day!!!
 - Deadline for absentee ballots
- November 12th
 - Canvass Deadline
 - Certification of Results
 - Certificate of Election (By District)
