#### **MEMORANDUM**

Re: Summer 2022 ISBA Policy Update Release, Part 2

**Note:** This is a short addendum to the Summer 2022 Update that includes new items to address the requirement to offer an option for self-directed learners as well as a related change to the model policy on extended learning opportunities.

## 2460 Extended Learning Opportunities

The new additions to this policy state that activities for which a fee is charged cannot be approved as an extended learning opportunity (ELO) and that activities for a religious purpose cannot be an ELO. These changes were made in light of concerns that emerged as Policy 2470 was being drafted. We wanted to ensure that activities related to either type of education activity didn't violate restrictions on charging fees for for-credit activities or existing model policy about not granting credit for religious activities conducted during release time. **This is a recommended update to a recommended policy.** 

#### 2470 Self-Directed Learners

This new policy addresses new legislation granting students a right to be designated as self-directed learners if they meet certain requirements. The State Legislature passed this legislation during the 2022 Session and it takes effect July 1. While it leaves to the district or charter school many of the details of establishing the criteria the student must meet and the kind of flexibility they can be granted, a process for designating self-directed learners is required. **This is a new required policy.** 

### 2470P Self-Directed Learner Procedure

This procedure accompanies Policy 2470 and offers further details on how the program might be implemented. **This is a new recommended policy.** 

### 2470F Application for Self-Directed Learner Status

This form offers a starting point for an application the District or Charter School can offer for students, parents/guardians, and teachers seeking self-directed learner status for a student. **This is a new optional form.**
